



TIDY TOWNS NEWFOUNDLAND AND LABRADOR

Tidy Towns is on a campaign to increase its judging roster. We are looking for women and men who were willing to go to the far corners of Labrador and all around the island. We are looking for volunteers who have the time and would enjoy traveling to several communities -- to meet the mayors and other municipal leaders -- to inspect and to surmise the assets -- to comment and instruct -- to photograph, to make copious notes, to write a brief two-page report -- to visit comparable-sized communities.

There is a judges' orientation session 2007 coming soon. Judges travel in pairs; no one needs to act alone. Judging starts approximately at the beginning of July and is not later than the end of August. Mileage, meals and accommodations are paid for, to provincial expense standards. To join you would be committing to judging at least two towns -- preferably eight towns to complete comparative evaluations in one population category (e.g. population 300 - 450 Charlottetown, Flowers Cove, Makkovik, Steady Brook, Woodstock and Woody Point).
